Garry W. Hood, age 70, of Cumberland County, passed away on May 15, 2025. Garry lived a life dedicated to service, community, and friendship. Born on April 15, 1955, he spent decades pouring his heart into the people and causes he loved.

Garry was the owner of Hood Funeral Home and Crematory. Garry was deeply committed to his community. He served as President of the Tennessee Funeral Directors Association from 2010 to 2011 and was a proud member of the Cumberland County Fair Board for 38 years. His love for the fair and its people was unmatched. He was the first representative from the Cumberland County Fair Board to serve as President of the Tennessee State Fair in 1998. During his presidency, he visited all 55 county and regional fairs across the state—an accomplishment that speaks volumes about his passion and dedication.

Beyond his fair involvement, Garry gave his time and talents to many organizations. He served as President of the PTO at North Cumberland Elementary School, was a member of the Board of Directors for the Cumberland County Farmers Co-op and was instrumental in organizing numerous community events. A devoted supporter of Cumberland County seniors, Garry often accompanied them on trips and would enjoy dining out and attending shows. He proudly sponsored Senior Day at the fair.

Garry had a heart for people. He never met a stranger and made friends everywhere he went. He cared deeply for those around him, and his kindness left a lasting impression on many.

Garry's legacy of love, laughter, and service will live on in all who knew him.

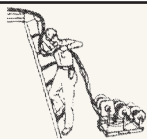

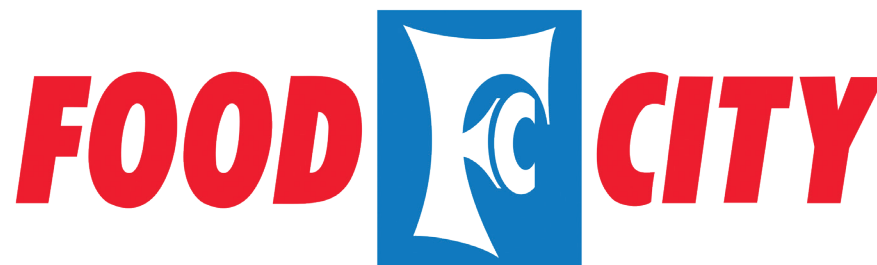
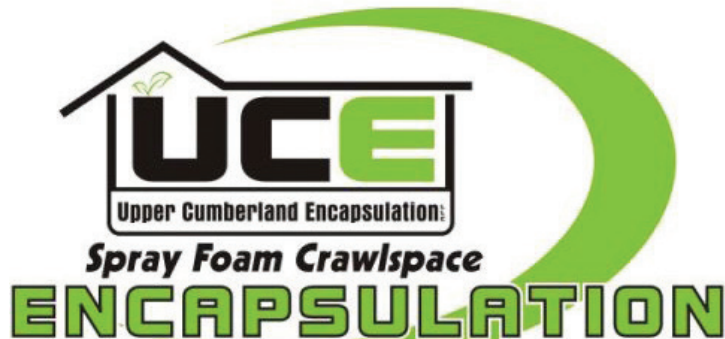

STATE AID TO FAIRS

The One Hundredth and Ninth General Assembly of the State of Tennessee, realizing the educational value of agriculture fairs in the state, appropriated money to be allocated by the State Department of Agriculture to the Fair Associations of the State to supplement premiums paid for agriculture exhibits, namely livestock, poultry, dairy products, junior agriculture, women's work, and other educational agriculture exhibits. This fair has been allocated its pro-rata share of the state aid appropriation.

For Purpose of further encouraging fairs to excel in their usefulness to their respective areas, a merit award provision was also made in the appropriation. It is hoped that the Cumberland County Fair can have an exhibition sufficiently creditable to warrant its receiving one of the special Merit Awards in addition to its allotment of State Aid.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Competition is open to all citizens of Cumberland County except the Open Livestock Shows which are open to the world.
2. All articles placed on exhibit shall be under the control of the superintendent of the department entered, and while every precaution will be taken by the superintendent and watchmen to prevent loss or damage, the Fair Association will in no case be responsible for damage or loss that might occur.
3. No premium will be paid for any article taken from the grounds before the appointed time.
4. No premium will be paid on entries unless they are listed in this catalog.
5. In case there is only one entry competing for a premium, at the discretion of the judges, they will award 1st and 2nd prizes as the exhibit deserves. Any entry that does not merit a premium in the estimation of the judges will be eliminated.
6. Premiums will be paid according to the placing shown on the department head's book and not according to ribbon.
7. The decision of the judges will be final.
8. Only one entry in a lot may be made by an individual, except where shown under department rules.
9. Only one entry may be made in the name of the owner in any lot, and must be the work of the person actually entering it unless otherwise specified.
10. All exhibits must contain the amount called for in this catalog to be eligible for a premium.
11. No exhibit may compete for more than one premium, except where specified.
12. The fair will be governed by these rules unless exceptions are made under various departments, in which case, the rule under the department will prevail.
13. **ITEMS ENTERED IN THE FAIR MUST REMAIN ON EXHIBIT UNTIL SUNDAY, AUGUST 24, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED. ITEMS MAY BE PICKED UP SUNDAY, AUGUST 24 FROM 1:00 TO 3:00 PM EXCEPT WHERE POSTED IN THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS. ALL ITEMS NOT PICKED UP BY 3:00 PM WILL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION.**
14. All fair checks must be picked up and cashed within THIRTY DAYS, otherwise they are void.
15. To enter items in "any other" category, there must not be a class for that item.
16. **Anyone entering items in the wrong age group will be disqualified unless they are competing in a higher age group. (Ex. K/1st grade student entering in 2nd/3rd grade division).**
17. **NO DOGS ALLOWED!**
18. **All entries must have been completed since the Fair of 2024, unless otherwise specified.**

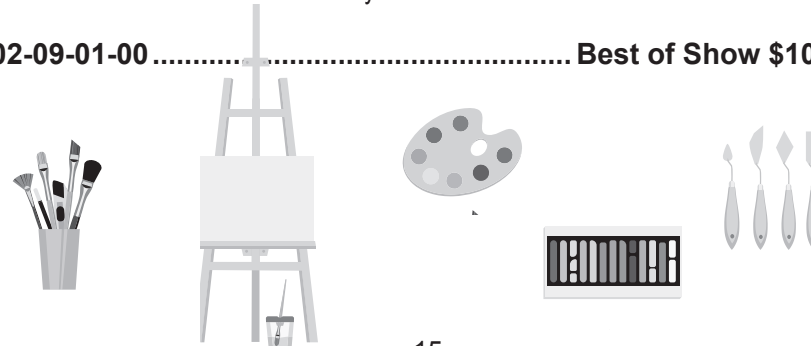

State officials have advised us that returning non-winning entries is against health regulations for the state. **We encourage only entering ONE-FOURTH OF THE PIE OR CAKE and THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF COOKIES needed for judging.** This will eliminate waste of your wonderful baked items.
6. All baking entries should be entered on a sturdy white paper plate or disposable pan. DO NOT SEND IN GLASS OR REGULAR CAKE PAN.
7. No professionals please.
8. All winning food items will be displayed but **will not** be returned at the end of the fair. Ribbons will be given on pick up day.

The "James Gang" brothers grew up on a horse farm near Sarasota, FL. They were involved with 4-H and showing American Paint Horses all across the world.

Other carnival owners would bring their rides to the James' farm for repairs during their off season. Then the brothers started building their own rides on the side. After selling a few Glass and Fun Houses, Dwayne decided to take one "out on the road".



In 1984, they booked four rides and some games with All American Shows. Years later, they made the move from Florida to Alabama including their horse farm.

By 1992, they were ready to start their own amusement company. Their mother, Virginia, came up with the name and the logo for their show. The horses in the logo are Matt and Peanut, two of their stud horses that were world champions. The world in the middle was because they showed horses all over the world.

Many of the rides that the show started with are still being operated today. The older ones are easier to work on and it



helps to be able to get parts here in the United States. The brothers do all necessary repairs and oversee maintenance of all rides.

James Gang Amusements owns the first Y-Factor thrill ride, built by Wisdom Manufacturing, an American Ride Manufacturer based out of Colorado. Currently, it is the only ride of its type in the world. Unique thrill rides have become a staple at James Gang, also operating one of only two Space Loop attractions in the United States.

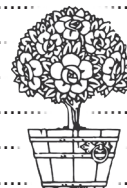

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

I. GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal

B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

(1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.

(2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle—Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP:

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS:

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been co-mingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

(1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.

(2) Tuberculosis:

(a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or

(b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two(2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

RULES

1. Entries must be entered between 2:00 pm and 6:00 pm Thursday, August 14 and remain on display until Sunday, August 24.
2. This is an amateur contest. No entrant shall be involved in any way with commercial wine making or use the facilities of commercial wineries, other than obtaining grapes, juice, concentrates, etc.
3. Each entry must be entered in a glass container (preferably bottle with cork) and contain not less than 1/2 pint or more than 1 quart. Attach label with name of wine and date made.
4. "Best of Show" ribbon will be awarded to the wine considered by the judges to be the best wine in the wine competition. First place wines in each category will be eligible for this award.
5. All entries must be completed since fair 2022.
6. Decisions of the judges will be final. The American Win Society guidelines will be used in judging the wines. Judges' decisions and placings are final.

40-01-01-00 Red American

These wines must be made from native or American hybrid grapes, still, and dry. (Examples: Concord, Ives, Muscadine, Cynthiana, etc.)

40-01-02-00 White American

These wines must be made from native or American hybrid grapes, still, and dry. (Examples: Niagra, Duchess, Diamond, Carlos, Magnolia, Margeurite, etc.)

40-01-03-00 Red Hybrid

These wines must be made from grapes crossed from more than one species usually exhibiting some "vinifera" characteristics, and may exhibit tannin and/or oak character. (Examples: DeChaunac, Cascade, Baco Noir, Chancellor, Chambourcin, Foch, Landot, Villard Noir, etc.)

40-01-04-00 White Hybrid

These wines must be made from grapes crossed from more than one species usually exhibiting some "vinifera" characteristics, and dry. (Examples: Cayuga, Ravat Blanc Aurore, Horizon, Raconeuf, Rayon D'or, Seyval, Vignoles Vidal Villard Blanc, etc.)

40-01-05-00 Red Vinifera

These wines must be made dry, from red vinifera grape species, exhibiting varietal character, with tannin and/or oak qualities if it enhances the wine. (Examples: Cabernet Sauvignon, Zinfandel, Pinot Noir, etc.)

40-01-06-00 White Vinifera

These wines must be dry, from white vinifera grape species, exhibiting varietal character, with slight oak qualities, if it enhances the wine. (Examples: Chardonnay, Reisling, Sauvignon Blanc, etc.)

40-01-07-00 Red Sweet

These wines must be made from any grape products, should be sweet, and capable of being enjoyed after a meal, alone or with dessert. (Examples: Ports, Sherries, Concentrates, Concord, Blends, etc.)

40-01-08-00 White Sweet

These wines must be made from any grape products, should be sweet, and capable of being enjoyed after a meal, alone or with dessert. Sweetness can vary, but should enhance rather than overpower the fruit quality. (Examples: Late Harvest Grapes, Grape Concentrated, Blends, etc.)

40-01-09-00 Rose/Blush

These wines should have a pink color or salmon, and sweetness may vary. They can be made from red grapes, fruit, or from blends. (Examples: Catawba, Strawberry, Muscadine, etc.)

40-01-10-00 Non-Grape

These wines must be made from any non-grape products, should exemplify all of the traits of the product from which they are made. Sweetness can vary, but should enhance rather than overpower the product quality. (Examples: Fruits, Concentrates, Honey, Blends, etc.)

40-01-11-00 Sparkling

These wines should have a good quality as well as lasting effervescences. Yeasty bouquets are not necessarily a negative characteristic. Sweetness can vary. They can be made from any grape or non-grape products. (Examples: Chardonnay, Apple, Vidal, etc.)

40-01-12-00 Fruit Sweet

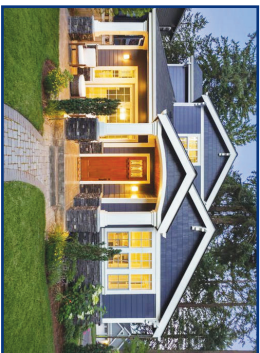

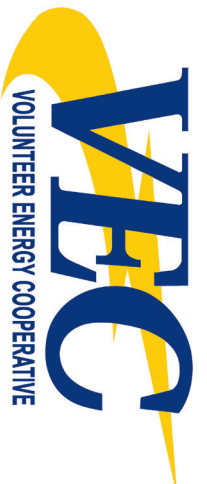
